Nordhavn's first entry into the sportfishing market, the 75 Expedition Yachtfisher, represents an ambitious move by the company to market a genuine bluewater fishing boat with the luxurious appointments of a superyacht.

## Sunseeker enters megayacht pantheon with Project Zeus

Sunseeker has revealed plans to move to a new aluminium construction process which will allow the British superyacht builder to create large, fully customised vessels in excess of 172 feet (52 metres).

If naming the project after the mythical Greek king of the gods is any indication of the company's ambitions, it could soon be taking on builds of Olympic proportions and tussling with some of the 'gods' of the superyacht industry to win custom build projects. Project Zeus will require changes to the construction processes currently employed in their very successful range of craft. Sunseeker has to date built yachts up to 150 feet (46 metres) but new facilities are being planned to accommodate the one-off building processes required for larger vessels with more customised designs.

"This is a very exciting time for the company. We have years of experience in building the highest quality motoryachts and I am very confident the move into larger bespoke shipbuilding will bring further success," said Sunseeker International managing director, Rob Braithwaite.

"What is reassuring is that our clients are asking us to make this move and the comments received on our initial designs have been extremely encouraging." The new Shipbuilding Division at Sunseeker will provide a fully integrated service of design, construction and project management. Each model will be totally unique, customised to the clients' individual requirements and built to appropriate classification depending on type and area of use.
